CALIBER-99

The INTERNET and associated technologies have made great impact on the libraries and information centres. The whole process of acquiring, organising and providing access to information is undergoing drastic change. The Academic and R&D libraries who work as catalyst in promoting academic and research work at the higher level, have been greatly affected by these new technologies. 2. CONVENTION DATES AND VENUE

Only accepted papers will be invited for the presentation in the Convention and will be printed in the proceedings volume. For the rest, abstracts will be printed. Papers should focus on the theme of the Convention. The decision of the Editorial Committee in this regard will be final and no correspondence regarding the inclusion of papers in the convention volume or otherwise will be entertained. WORKSHOP REPORT

The Workshop on Automation and Networking University Libraries under INFLIBNET Programme was held from 3rd to 9th August, 1998 at the INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad. This workshop was in a way unique compared to earlier three workshops held during 1994 to 1996, as it was conducted exclusively for the Heads of the libraries of the 18 universities, who have been funded under INFLIBNET Programme during 1997-98. The main objectives of the workshop were:

- To develop and promote mutual understanding between INFLIBNET Centre and the participating libraries.
- To discuss various issues involved, approach to be adopted and responsibilities to be shouldered by both the Centre and Libaries, in smooth implementation of the Programme.
- To acquaint with the activities and services of the INFLIBNET.
- To provide state-of-the-art technologies involved in the implementation.

The workshop was inaugurated by Shri Pramod Kumar, Director of INFLIBNET Centre. In his inaugural address, Shri Kumar highlighted the importance of the workshop and asked the librarians to come forward and enthusiastically participate in the implementation of INFLIBNET.

This workshop was divided into the following two divisions and topics covered under both the divisions were as follows:

PART A: LECTURES AND PRESENTATIONS

- INFLIBNET Programme: activities, services and future plans.
- Presentations by Librarians.
- Management of library automation and networking.
- Bibliographical standards and database creation.
- · Networking of libraries.
- · Retro-conversion and Resource-sharing.
- Advances in information technologies / tools, such as CD-ROM, Internet and GIST.
- · Suggestions and recommendatins by paticipants



PART B: PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATION AND HANDS-ONSESSIONS

- Integrated Library Management Software.
- · Union Databases.
- · CDS / ISIS
- · CD-ROM Databases.
- · Internet Searching.

The interesting part of this workshop was the presentations made by each participant, highlighting the activities and services of their respective libraries and the expectations from the INFLIBNET. The emphasis was on practical aspects and problem solving through the active interaction between the INFLIBNET Centre staff, invited experts and the participants. There were number of issues on which discussions were held which were directly relevant to the implementation of INFLIBNET Programme.

There were in all seven experts who were invited to deliver the lectures, besides the INFLIBNET staff who acted as resource persons. This workshop was found effective in building up the rapport between INFLIBNET and the participating university libraries. During this workshop, a number of decisions have been taken with the mutual consent to effectively put through the programme. It is expected that by the end of this year, all these 18 universities funded would begin their automation activities.

This workshop was conducted as a part of manpower development activity of the INFLIBNET. This was fourth in the series of the workshops conducted so far. Besides, INFLIBNET Centre has also conducted 16 intensive training programmes (of four weeks duration each) for the staff members working in different university libraries in the country. All these courses and workshops have been received well by the universities and found to be effective in automation and networking of the activities.

SERIAL HOLDINGS DATABASE

INFLIBNET is creating the databases of union catalogue of serial holdings and current serials of university libraries. Number of libraries have contributed the holding details during the last two years. The data so received has been authenticated and is now available online through INFLIBNET web page http://www.inflibnet.ernet.in. The table presents number of records available in the database contributed by each participating university. Centre has also collected the

Current Serials data from more than 150 universities, the authentication of which is in the final stage and the same will soon be available for online access.

SEARCH ENGINE

The five union databases viz. books, theses, serials, experts and research projects are developed at INFLIBNET using CDS/ISIS. To make an effective use of these databases, it has been decided to provide an on-line access, so that actual resource sharing could take place. For this purpose, the data available in these respective databases has now been transferred to a RDBMS (Sybase 11.01) using specially designed interfaces (compatible to ISO-2709 format). Keeping in view the latest trends in IT towards Middle Tier Architecture i.e. to provide access to the databases on INTERNET using browsers, INFLIBNET has developed search engines to access all above mentioned databases. The search engines can be accessed through http://www.inflibnet.ernet.in to search the above five databases.

SEVENTEENTH TRAINING COURSE

The training course on application of computers to Library and Information services is being arranged from 23rd November to 19th December, 1998 with a revised course content.

INFLIBNET Centre has been conducting training courses of four weeks duration covering various

aspects, both theory and practice, required for implementation of automation and networking of the libraries. Till now, 16 such courses have been conducted and the next one is being planned from 23rd November to 19th December, 1998. This particular course is being organized exclusively for the operational staff of the recently (1997-1998) funded 18 university libraries.

1. OBJECTIVES

- To prepare the operational staff from the participating university libraries to handle the computerisation and networking.
- To develop confidence in the participants to implement the computerisation of in- house operations and database creation activities at their respective libraries.
- To equip the participants with adequate skills in handling various problem areas involved in automation and networking.
- To provide practical experience (how-to-do-it) by allowing each participant to spend most of his/her training time using computers independently.

3. ELIGIBILITY

He/She should have Masters Degree in Library & Information Science. Should have shown keen interest, taken initiative in computerisation of their library and have acquired some basic skills in handling computers. Those who have attended similar courses conducted by INFLIBNET earlier are not eligible for this course.

The age of the participant should not be more than 35 years, to absorb new technology and in any case should not exceed 40 years for participants with good qualifications and experience.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY PROFILE

TATA INSTITUTE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES LIBRARY: A PROFILE

Tata Institue of Social Sciences is one of the premier institutions in Social Work in the Country. It was established in the year 1936 by the Tatas, the industrial tycoons and great supporters of social cause, has now grown to an outstanding institute in the field of social work both nationally and internationally. It was conferred as a deemed university in 1964 and has then on proceeded to provide numerous courses at various levels in the field of social sciences, social work, personnel management, industrial relations, health sciences etc. A great deal of research & development activities take place at Tata Institute of Social Sciences by the students & faculty members of high caliber.

The Library

Library has been playing a great role in the growth of this institute and it's research activities. Tata Institute of Social Science library established along with the Institue has over the years built up one of the excellent collections of books and journals and other reading materials to suppot both academic and research activities of the Institute. It has now over 91,000 books and subscribes to 430 national and international journals in the field of social sciences. A good number of journals are also received on an exchange basis against its prestigious journal 'Indian Journal of Social Work. This library has also unique collection of non-book materials. The major strength of this library is its unique collection and the service.

Library Automation

The 1990's marks the advent of libray automation throughout India. As Tata Institue of Social Sciences is one of the leading teaching and research institute, it can not be left behind in the automation process.

The Tata Institute of Social Sciences library started automation of its activities in 1994 using CDS/ISIS with the financial grant of Rs. 5 lakh from HDFC. This activity got further impetus, when UGC provided a grant of Rs. 7.5 lakhs (one plus six and half lakhs) for the automation and networking under INFLIBNET programme.

During the last two years, library has made tremendous progress in automation. It has acquired number of



computers, CD-ROM databases and a commercially developed library automation software. The creation of databases of books, serials and theses has almost been completed. Soon the circulation transaction will be on-line. Barcoding of the collection is in the offing. The plan for putting the library databases on the campus LAN is being worked out.

Tata Institute of Social Sciences Library is taking an active part in resource sharing at local and national level and has been contributing its data to the Union databases created by INFLIBNET. This library has great potentialities to become one of the Document Delivery Centres under the INFLIBNET programme. Recently, Tata Institute of Social Sciences Library has acquired connection to INTERNET through VSNL & NICNET and has further extended its services.

Besides books journals and other reading materials, library regularly subscribes to following databases on CD-ROM:

- 1. Social Science Citation Index
- 2. Wilson Social Science Abstracts
- 3. Suchak
- 4. World Development Report
- 5. Business India and Seminar

To support the research work in the institute from time to time, library compiles bibliographies on number of topics. Some of the prominent topics on which bibliographies are brought out on regular basis are given below:

- 1. South Asian Regional Conferences
- 2. Social Work Education in India
- 3. Youth in India
- 4. Aging in India

With its unique collection, automation of all activities, and will to share the resources, Tata Institute of Social Sciences library under the dynamic leadership of a young Librarian, Dr. Muttayya Koganuarmath will be one of the potential place for social science information, both at the national & international level.

TABLE OF CONTENTS SERVICE

INTERNET has been very effectively used by the publishing industry to promote books, journals etc. that they publish. During last few years, most of the
