SOUL Installation

Since its launching at Chennai during CALIBER-2000, the SOUL has received an overwhelming response from all types of libraries. There have been number of enquiries from all over the country requesting for supply of SOUL. So far this software has been successfully installed in 27 institutions. A team consisting of two Scientists from INFLIBNET visited all these institutions, successfully installed the SOUL and imparted an extensive training for six days to the core staff of the libraries. They also took this opportunity to demonstrate the software to a large number of librarians from the respective cities.

Now more than 30 institutions have placed orders for SOUL and the installation in all these places is being planned.

SOUL - Single User Version

To meet the growing demand for single user (stand alone) version of SOUL at an affordable cost, INFLIBNET has come out with another version of SOUL to work on Windows 95/98 platform. This version is being tested and will be ready for release by end of April, 2001. Cost of this version will be Rs.15,000/-.

SOUL User Forum

INFLIBNET has launched yet another forum called "SOUL User Forum" to facilitate the SOUL users spread all over the country to come together and discuss the problems with INFLIBNET. The first user meeting under this forum was held at Pune on 15th March, 2001 co-inciding with CALIBER-2001. This was attended by more than 50 persons which included existing and prospective users of SOUL. The one and half hour discussion addressed all the major issues relating to SOUL. Director and technical staff of INFLIBNET Centre, actively participated and guided the discussion. It is proposed to hold such meetings frequently to address the problems faced by SOUL users.

SOUL Pricing

Cost of the multi-user version of SOUL (first copy) is Rs.50,000/-. This includes SOUL on CD, comprehensive manual, multi-lingual interface software, installation and extensive on-site training for six days and one year warranty. This price has been approved by the Governing Board

of the INFLIBNET and was announced during CALIBER-2000 at Chennai. Recently, number of libraries showed keen interest in purchasing more than one copy of SOUL and many colleges and small libraries requested for the single user version. Keeping in view the growing demand for SOUL, following prices have fixed.

- SOUL multi user version for second and subsequent copies - Rs. 20,000 (per copy)
(This covers only SOUL on CD and User manual) + actual cost of multilingual interface.
- SOUL Single User Version - Rs.15,000/- (SOUL CD and Manual)

CALIBER 2001

The eighth national convention "CALIBER-2001" was successfully held in collaboration with University of Pune, Pune from March 15-16, 2001. The main theme of this convention was Creation and Management of Digital Resources. The main theme was divided into following sub themes

- Digitisation
- Acquisition and Archiving of Digital Resources
- Services
- Strategic Management

The convention was inaugurated by Dr Vijay P. Bhatkar, the former Executive Director of C-DAC, Pune who also delivered a key note address on this occasion. More than 250 delegates from

different parts of the country attended this convention. There were in all 84 papers presented by the respective authors. The pre-convention volume, covering full text of 39 selected papers and abstracts of 45 papers on the above theme was brought out and distributed to delegates. Prof. R. G. Takwale, the former vice chancellor of IGNOU was the chief guest for the valedictory function, who also addressed the delegates. Two pre-convention tutorials on 'Development of Databases in Indian Languages' and 'Metadata' were conducted on 14th March 2001 which were well attended. During the valedictory function, number of resolutions have been passed which are being taken up by INFLIBNET for implementation.

Visit to Universities

INFLIBNET staff frequently visits the university libraries covered under the programme to attend to the technical problems and guide them in automation, database creation etc. During the period January-March 2001, INFLIBNET staff visited the following universities. MARC 21 Implementation

Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India visualizes building up of a national database of library holdings in the country. All libraries are expected to contribute their data to this national database. For putting this plan into action, MHRD desires that all libraries in the country should follow a uniform standard for data entry. A Sub-Group was set up by MHRD to identify a format for this purpose. The Sub - Group has recommended that MARC 21 format be followed now onwards for data entry in libraries. The main reason for preferring MARC 21 over CCF and other formats was that most of the countries in the world use MARC and it is comprehensive having number of fields. Also there is a constant development taking place in MARC 21 and is updated regularly whereas CCF has become stagnant. With MARC 21 based national database, it will be easier to exchange data with other countries.

The Sub - Group also advised INFLIBNET Centre to adopt MARC 21 and inform all university libraries about this decision and to ask them to use MARC 21. Accordingly, all libraries covered under INFLIBNET are advised to start using MARC21. For libraries using SOUL software, there is no cause for any alarm over this decision. INFLIBNET Centre has already developed an interface software for exporting data from SOUL to MARC 21 incorporating all primary fields identified by the Sub-Group. We have already initiated work on developing another interface for importing data from MARC 21 to SOUL. This development is expected to be over by end of April 2001. Both these interfaces will be provided to SOUL users. Then we intend to develop next version of SOUL totally based on MARC 21. Till the second version of SOUL is developed, libraries having SOUL, can continue to

use it and use the interface for converting SOUL data to MARC 21.

As a part of its continued support to the university libraries for modernisation under INFLIBNET programme, UGC has sanctioned non-recurring grant of Rs.6.5 lakhs each to the following 19 universities. This grant has been provided for creating the necessary infrastructure in each library for computerisation and LAN. These libraries will procure computers, operating system, RDBMS, SOUL - Library Management Software and other peripherals using this initial grant and initiate the computerisation work. These universities will also be supported for the first five years with a recurring grant to meet the salary of "Information Scientist" (a post created specially to take care of INFLIBNET programme implementation at respective universities), data entry work including retrospective conversion, telephone charges, consumables and maintenance charges.

All the 19 libraries funded under the programme will have to sign a Memorandum of Understanding and follow the guidelines with respect to database creation and automation, recommended by INFLIBNET. These libraries will also have to use SOUL developed by INFLIBNET for library automation.

To address various issues involved, approaches to be adopted and to promote better understanding of the total responsibility of implementation INFLIBNET Centre is organising a separate workshop at Ahmedabad from June 25-July 1, 2001 for the Heads of libraries of these participating universities.

NISSAT Project

NISSAT Funds a Project on Expert Manpower

NISSAT has approved an invited project on **Development and Managing a Web enabled**

Database of Expert Manpower in the area of Science and Technology submitted by INFLIBNET. This is a two-year project and INFLIBNET will be responsible for the development and maintenance of the database.

The coverage of database will be very wide. It will cover faculty members and researchers from all Indian universities including deemed universities, National laboratories, R & D Institutions, Science and Technology Departments of Central and State governments, Editorial Board members of S & T periodicals, Fellows of scientific academies and winners of Science and Technology awards etc.

INFLIBNET will adopt latest technology in designing the database and make it available for online access over the Internet. The information in the database will contain name and address of expert with his/her academic and research achievements and areas of specialisation. The database will be loaded on the Vigyan Server located at NCSI, Bangalore. Apart from online version, it will be available in different format viz. print and CD-ROM etc. Separate search option will enable the user to retrieve the information under all important search terms. This is a joint effort of INFLIBNET and NISSAT for promoting the content on the Internet. Having expertise in developing similar databases, INFLIBNET hopes to complete this project in the stipulated period.

University Library Profile

Banasthali Vidyapith

Banasthali Vidyapith is a unique centre for learning from nursery to post-graduate stage, offering modern education to girls, without sacrificing India's basic cultural tradition and values. Some of its significant aspects are its harmonious synthesis of the spiritual and scientific values of the East and the West. It has developed

on the principle of program education like Panchmukhi Shiksha consisting of physical, practical, aesthetic, and varied range of cocurricular activities. The Vidyapith was established in 1935 by Pandit Hiralal Shastri, former Chief Minister of Rajasthan. The Vidyapith became a deemed university in the year 1983. Today it is the only fully residential university for women education in the country, which aims at developing all around personality of women students. As a centre for women education, the Vidyapith recognizes the identity of women to lead society and to bear the responsibilities of their homes and the nation.

Library

Today the Central Library and faculty libraries have a total of 1,62,319 books and other non-book materials. The library collection includes 10,000 backvolumes, 515 theses and dissertations, and a few thousand miscellaneous items (albums, charts, maps, pamphlets etc.). The Library collection pertains to various departments/subjects for which the Vidyapith conducts post-graduate courses on the campus. It is particularly strong in Indological subjects, and subjects like Economics, Political Science, English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Education as well as subjects of sciences like Mathematics, Computer Science and Electronics, Biotechnology, Home Science and Chemistry. The Library collection is equally strong in Visual Arts, Textile Designing, Gandhina and Women Studies. The Central Library runs three faculty libraries. These are Faculty of Education, Faculty of Management and Apaji Institute of Mathematics. The Central Library has been functioning as leading resource centre of the Vidyapith. The Central Library subscribes to 600 current journals in the subjects, which are covered at the Vidyapith. Today there are 2000 members of the library.

Service

The Library has been serving various components of the Vidyapith community viz. faculty, students and staff, towards fulfillment of the objectives. The Central Library of the Vidyapith is kept open from 8.00 AM to 7.00 PM on all working days of the year. It remains open from 10.00 AM to 6.00 PM on Tuesday and holidays. The library provides reading and lending facilities, inter library loan, reference service, bibliographical and photocopying services. The library catalogue records have been prepared with great care according to AACR II and books are classified according to Dewey Decimal Classification. For assigning the subject headings, Sears List and LC Subject Headings are used. The library provides full bibliographical information of the documents.

Automation

The work of automation of the library functions and services were initiated in the year 2000 with the purchase and installation of 6 computers, one server and SOUL software. These computers are used to develop in-house computer database of books and periodicals. The library has created 10,000 records of books in machine readable format, and are planning to create periodicals and dissertation records in machine readable format. It is to be noted that the Vidyapith has already LAN set up by which the departments can access OPAC.

INFLIBNET Support

With the financial assistance provided by the INFLIBNET in 1999-2000, the library purchased 5 Pentiums III computers, and one server. The library started retro-conversion of bibliographical records of books with SOUL software by employing more than 100 students. The Banasthali Vidyapith has been also providing all help to the library from time to time for library computerization.

Future Plan

The library plans to computerize its Circulation functions in near future. The basic job of updating membership data, retro-conversion of old bibliographical records and bar coding of books is going to start. The library plans to barcode the membership cards also. The library would like to put extra computer systems for Online Public Access Catalogue and Internet access.

Staff News

Shri Pramod Kumar, the first Director of INFLIBNET Centre successfully completed his second term as Director and took premature retirement from the services of Centre from 28th February, 2001.

Shri. S. M. Salgar, Scientist - G, who has been with INFLIBNET since beginning, has taken over the charge from Shri Pramod Kumar as Acting Director on 28th February, 2001.

A farewell function was organised by the staff at INFLIBNET in honour of out going Director, Shri Pramod Kumar on 5th March, 2001. The staff lauded the yeoman service rendered by him to INFLIBNET and extended warm welcome to Shri S. M. Salgar as Acting Director.
