

- ❖ Do user surveys for improvements










Examples for Best Practices


The following examples on availability, accessibility and usage of best practices examples explain how the best practices can be applied in a library:

Educational Opportunities


Libraries provide educational resources and programs for all ages, promoting literacy and lifelong learning.

a. Library Management:
